RECENT EVENTS

Open Meeting, 12th April

There were twenty-five supporters who had the chance to learn more about Baguia and Timor Leste at this meeting. Guests included Stonnington Mayor, Anne O'Shea, 2 students from Korowa (their school is funding scholarships in Baguia), and a representative of John Scheffer MLC. We welcomed two young women, Elizabeth and Mary, originally from Baguia, but now studying in Melbourne. We hope that they will join us in future activities.

Derarca gave us a report of her recent visit to Baguia, illustrated with many photos. Elizabeth and Mary recognised relatives and places in many of them, and answered questions about life in Timor Leste. They stressed that health was a big problem, especially malaria and TB, and that doctors and nurses were in short supply.

Friends of Baucau meeting

The Friends of Baucau, supported by Darebin and Yarra Councils, presented a public meeting "Womens' Friendship with the World's Newest Nation", last month.

The Friendship Agreement with Baucau has Womens' Development as a core principle, and, so far, they have built a Learning Centre, and have employed a coordinator for the womens' Development Program. The Timorese coordinator (Benvinda) spoke about the programs, including Small Business, Domestic Violence, Literacy, and Health.

Talks about East Timor

Stonnington U3A presented three talks about Timor Leste during April. Their members appreciated the opportunity to learn about this new country.

Derarca spoke about life in Timor and the role of friendship groups. Other talks were Travel by Jane Crouch, and Experience with the International Force by Chip Andressen.

Our first official fundraising event was held at the Mecanix restaurant in Swinburne's hospitality school. 88 of our supporters and friends had a great night of fine food and great speakers.
