Funds sent to East Timor!

Baguia have confirmed that they received our first transfer of funds to East Timor. Due to the conflict in May there was a delay in the monies getting to Baguia. We received "thanks" from several people in Baguia who are really thrilled to see this commitment to their community from Australia.

In total <u>Aust\$4,500</u> was provided to Baguia. This money has been used for the following projects:

- 1. 37 Junior High School Scholarships for 2006.
- 2. Salaries for two Osso Huna Teachers Jan to June 2006.
- 3. Bread for Orphanage Jan to June 2006.
- 4. Three Women's Literacy Programs.
- 5. Concrete for Rufaguia Primary School floor.

Armadale Primary School

Armadale primary school teacher Amanda Tiller contacted Friends of Baguia with a request to come and talk to the Grade 3 and 4 students about East Timor and in particular about Baguia.

Susan Cosgrave who has been involved with Friends of Baguia since inception, visited the school bearing posters of Baguia. During her discussion on Baguia, the children were interested to discover that many children who live in Baguia walk from between one and two hours a day to attend school. In response to this, the students decided that they are going to do some activities centered on learning more about East Timor, and perhaps to do a walkathon to support some of the projects currently promoted through Friends of Baguia.

In an effort to improve cultural understanding between our countries the students might also write simple letters with some drawings to children in Baguia. Before doing this the Armadale students will learn some words in tetum so they can use these on their drawings.

September 13th is earmarked as a day for focusing on activities promoting diversity in our

world, and the students at Armadale will ensure their focus is on East Timor.

Malvern Rotary

Derarca O'Mahony did a presentation to a luncheon meeting of the Rotary Club of Malvern on July 12th to introduce them to the work being done by the Friends group in Baguia. There were many questions after her talk, indicating an interest in the situation in Timor. Malvern Rotary will give consideration to providing support in the future for the people in Baguia District.
