DERARCA'S RECENT VISIT TO BAGUIA

I spent 6 weeks in East Timor during September and October 2006, with 41/2 weeks in Baguia. There is no violence in Baguia Sub-District as the conflict is restricted to Dili. However, most people in Baguia would be too frightened to travel into Dili. Consequently there are some food shortages and high prices in the Districts. The Baguia community is under stress due to the large number of refugees that have left Dili and are now staying mainly with their extended families. Some schools in have doubled in size. Larisula High School has only 3 class-rooms but 6 classes of students, so the teachers have to teach the school in two shifts - one in the morning and the remainder in the afternoon. Many lives have been totally disrupted by the current situation in Dili, and I encountered many sad tales.

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS IN BAGUIA

- •Confirmed that FoB's first funds transfer (May 2006) had been correctly administered by Management Committee in Baguia (MCB).
- •Reviewed current projects with MCB to determine the best allocation of the funds transferred from Australia in October 2006.
- •Translated documents into Tetum language, eg: Scholarships Guidelines.
- •Met with Sr Luis Guterres (Baucau District Administrator) updating him on the projects and funding to Baguia.
- •Attended opening of Rufaguia Primary School FoB has provided some funding towards construction materials.
- •Identified future projects in Sub-District.

LEARNINGS for Friends of Baguia

- •Timor is a constantly changing environment, hence FoB must maintain its close contact with MCB to ensure future projects continue to be well managed.
- •In the true spirit of "Friendship" we must listen to the community of Baguia as to how we can best assist them. eg: evaluate setting up a computer project.
- •To strengthen our "Friendship" with Baguia, we need to consider bringing a Timorese person to Stonnington, and providing them with training.

As always the people of Baguia welcomed me with their generous Timorese spirit and smiles. They frequently asked me to pass on their sincere gratitude to their wonderful "Friends" in Stonnington, who in small ways are starting to make some BIG differences in their lives. As they said in Tetum - "Obrigada Barak!" - A BIG Thankyou!

ARMADALE PRIMARY SCHOOL

September 13th was the day promoting diversity in our world. Grade 3 and 4 students at Armadale Primary focused on East Timor and wore the Timorese colours. In empathy with students in Baguia, some students walked to school, others decided they would honour the day by not eating any processed food, and some didn't watch any television. Susan Cosgrave & Jean Ling (FoB committee members) participated in the day, with Jean translating words into Tetum as the students prepared to do their drawings.

We now have a collection of these drawings that in simple terms describe the student's lives. Common things such as family members, school, homes and food are labelled in Tetum. We anticipate that these drawings will soon be making their way to children in Baguia, hopefully beginning an ongoing friendship.

The students raised \$250, which was presented to FoB. These funds will be used to provide black-boards and other school equipment to the remote mountain primary school at Rufaguia.
