Our current projects in Baguia

This is a brief overview of the current projects that we are supporting in Baguia Sub-District:

- Women and Children's Nutritional workshops run in three villages by local women
- 60 Scholarships to three Junior High schools in Baguia Sub-District (including students from refugee families)
- 12 Scholarships to Baguia Senior High School
- Five Scholarships to Baguia students attending Senior High in Baucau or Dili
- One Scholarship to Dili University
- Teacher's salary at Osso Huna Community School
- Desks and internal walls for volunteer-built Gulari mountain school
- Adult English Classes for 3 levels
- Women's Literacy Classes –
 Celestina teaches Tetum to illiterate village women
- Workshop on management and health of chickens
- Assistance to computer courses program
- Women's sewing group sourcing markets for their traditional embroidery
- Soccer and Volleyballs/nets to schools – this is a constant request!
