#### Light up Timor Leste

Timor Leste is only one hour by plane from Darwin. It has just celebrated 10 years as a new nation and is busy building everything from a police force to an education system. Much progress has been made with help from many countries including Australia but there is still a long way to go.



For many years now the Alternative Technology Association (ATA) has been working in Timor Leste to provide small scale solar power installations in remote villages. In 2013 ATA in collaboration with Timor Adventures is offering *Light up Timor Leste* tours so that others can become involved in this wonderful project whilst also having a really good holiday.

#### Baguia

The Sub-district of Baguia comprises of 10 sub-villages and is located on the eastern side of Mt Matebian: the second highest mountain in Timor Leste. Mt Matebian's rocky terrain provided good cover for the Falintil Guerrillas in their fight against the Indonesians and was a key stronghold.

The population of the Baguia Sub-district is around 10,000. Most people's homes are of simple construction from bamboo with a thatched roof. Rice is grown in the lower areas using terracing; while higher up the mountain the terraces grow corn and beans. Water buffalo are used to till the land. Transport around Baguia Sub-district is problematic as most villages have no passable roads and so can only be reached by walking. People in this remote area can't afford to own vehicles, so getting to school or the twice weekly market at Baguia town is always on foot. However, a daily bus or truck enables people to

Communication is very limited as there is no postal service at all. The Sub-district has no electricity, except in Baguia town.

Despite these difficulties, the people of Baguia are a very proud people and have a strong sense of both local and Timorese identity. (*Friends of Baguia*)



#### Alternative Technology Australia (ATA)



The ATA (Alternative Technology Association) is an Australia not-for-profit organisation promoting sustainable technology and practice. The ATA provides services to members who are actively using good building design, conserving water and renewable energy.

Since 2001, the Alternative Technology Association has installed solar lighting and power systems in over 1000 homes, community centres, schools, hospitals and training centres in remote villages in Timor Leste
